Our Mission is to Prevent
Blindness and Preserve Sight

Prevent Blindness brings Americans to eye care.

**We build awareness, create access
to eye care, and support patients.**

**We provide information, resources, and technical
assistance; influence public policy;
help shape public health systems of care.**

- **We increase awareness and educate the public** on the importance of taking care of their eyes.
- **We advocate for public policy and resources that ensure everyone has affordable, accessible, and quality eye care options;** these include preventive vision screenings, comprehensive eye exams and appropriate treatment, and low vision devices.
- **We provide patient support through education and awareness campaigns, free/low-cost eye care assistance through industry partnerships,** and programs that empower individuals living with vision challenges – and their caregivers.
- **Our National Center for Children’s Vision and Eye Health** is strengthening public health systems that advance a continuum of vision care for young children by helping states strengthen screening protocols, improve access to exams and treatment, bolster capacity for surveillance and develop measurements for success.
- **We serve as a resource for public health professionals** on areas related to eye health through an annual national eye health summit, webinars, allied health education, surveillance efforts, research grants, and professional recognition awards.

MESSAGE FROM THE CEO & BOARD PRESIDENT



Prevent Blindness continued to expand its role as a national voice for vision, advocating for sound national public health policies, evidence-based children's vision programs and access to quality vision care for Americans of all ages. Sight-saving programs at Prevent Blindness and its affiliates, including professional education, patient services, and vision screenings, served more than 2.4 million people this year. We reached millions more through public eye health and safety awareness campaigns, through web-based resources at preventblindness.org and Living Well with Low Vision, and on social media.

The National Center for Children's Vision and Eye Health at Prevent Blindness entered its 10th year working with partners in ophthalmology, optometry, pediatrics, education and public health to promote a continuum of eye health and vision care for young children.

Guided by the National Center, Prevent Blindness trained and certified vision screeners provided evidence-based screenings to more than 1.1 million preschool and school-aged children. A vision

screening assesses a child's vision for the most common vision problems and if necessary, refers the child to an eye doctor for further evaluation.

The screening can also initiate the conversation around eye care for the child and their parent/guardian, helping to ensure that the child's eyes stay safe and healthy.

To help families in need, Prevent Blindness distributed more than 10,000 vouchers for free eye exams and glasses provided by longtime partners VSP and OneSight.

Prevent Blindness took its advocacy for children's vision to Congress, urging legislators to enact a long-term extension for the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) and provide children with access to the vision care services they need to grow, develop, learn, and play.

On July 17, 2018, patient advocates from around the country attended the thirteenth annual **Eyes on Capitol Hill** advocacy day in Washington, D.C., meeting with legislators and their staff to speak on vision issues and to request support for public health programs.

As a result of these efforts, Congress increased spending to a number of programs that impact vision and eye health, including funding to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)'s Vision Health Initiative and the Glaucoma project. The Maternal and Child Health Bureau, part of the Health Resources and Services Administration, and the National Eye Institute (NEI) under the National Institutes of Health were also fully funded.

Recognizing the role of the NEI in vision and eye health was the central theme of this year's **Focus On Eye Health National Summit**: "Research to Impact: Honoring 50 Years of the National Eye Institute." Attendees of the event at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C. included patient advocates, eye care professionals and academicians, pharmaceutical and vision industry partners, national vision and eye health organizations, government representatives, and community-based organizations.

Prevent Blindness launched a new awareness campaign: **See America's Hidden Gems**, www.see-america.org, to celebrate the joy of sight, to increase awareness of the diseases and conditions that can cause preventable blindness, and to encourage all Americans to make eye health a priority.

Prevent Blindness could not have undertaken these successful programs without the generous support of its corporate sponsors, government and foundation grants, and donors who made individual gifts or attended our Person of Vision event in New York to honor Sue Downes, CEO at MyEyeDr., or who joined our Swing Fore Sight Golf tournaments in Las Vegas and Chicago. We also thank our volunteers: our certified screeners, our board and committee members, and many others for their tireless work on behalf of better vision.

And with your help, our important work will continue. With the recent establishment of the **Center for Vision and Population Health**, Prevent Blindness will expand its capacity in the coming year as a national coordinating body for programs and practices that

improve eye care, vision, and public health. This new center will collaborate with community, state, and national stakeholders in furtherance of our abiding mission to prevent blindness and preserve sight.

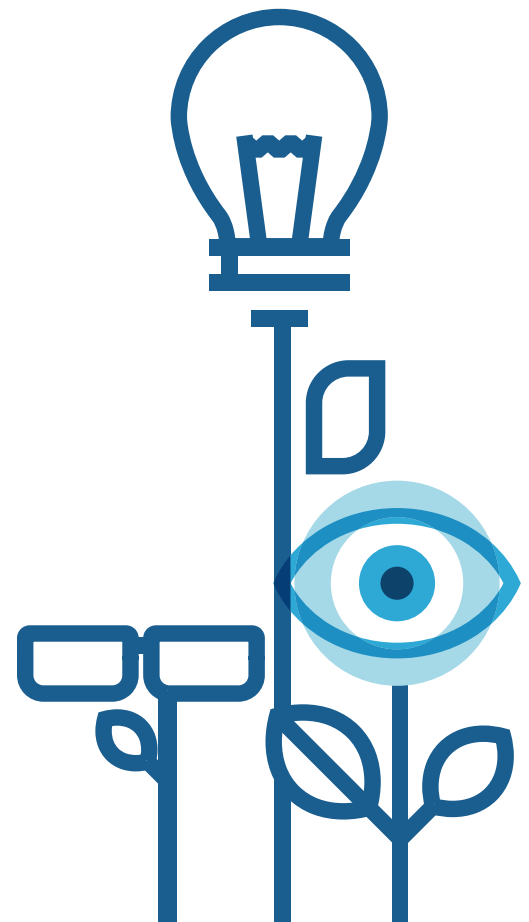

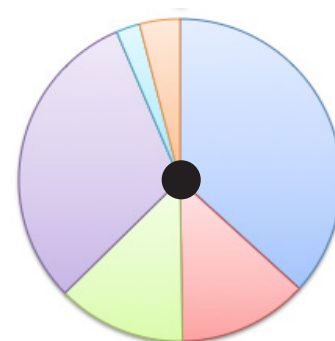

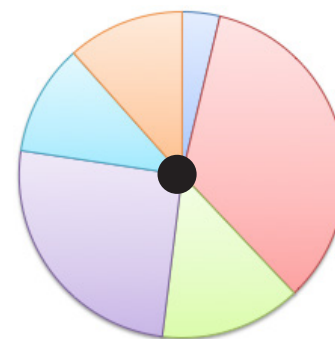
